

ABOUT FORT DOBBS

- Fort Dobbs is North Carolina's only French and Indian War (1754–63) State Historic Site.
- Fort Dobbs State Historic Site is located in present-day Statesville, North Carolina and provides a window into the tumultuous period of history known as the French and Indian War (1754-1763) or Seven Years War. It represents North Carolina's link with a global war for empire between England and France that crossed five continents, lasted nearly a decade and sowed the seeds for independence.
- Fort Dobbs is owned by the state of North Carolina and is administered through the Department of Cultural Resources' Division of State Historic Sites and Properties.
- The Friends of Fort Dobbs, a 501(c)3, not-for-profit volunteer organization with more than 1000 members nationwide, provides additional financial assistance for educational programs, special events and other needs not covered by the state budget.

March 8-9: **Preparing for the 1758 Campaign**. The fort's garrison will focus heavily on military drill as the spring thaw opens another campaigning season. 10a.m-4p.m.

April 19-20: **War for Empire 1758**. Fort Dobbs comes alive with soldiers, Indians and civilians as we look at NC's role in the French and Indian War. Hundreds of Provincial soldiers from NC served under John Forbes during his successful campaign to capture French Fort DuQuesne. The event will feature a recreation of a 1758 skirmish, as well as scholarly lectures from guest speakers. 10a.m.-4p.m. Reservations for free school day April 18, call: 704-873-5882

- May 17-18: **Fortifying the Post**. Provincial soldiers continue to improve the defenses of Fort Dobbs, while sharpening their skill at musket and artillery drill. 10a.m-4p.m.
- August 2-3: **Guarding the Frontier**. The fort's garrison practices the skills they need to effectively patrol NC's Western frontier and guard the post of Fort Dobbs. 10a.m.-4p.m.
- October 4-5: **18**th **Century Trade Faire**. This event focuses on the civilians whose lives were disrupted by the French and Indian War. Indians, tradesmen, militia, soldiers, and others will set up their camps around Fort Dobbs and allow the public to experience a snapshot of life in the 1750's. The event will feature a recreation of a 1760 Indian raid, as well as scholarly lectures by guest speakers. Reservations for free school day October 3, call: 704-873-5882.
- November 8-9: **Food at the Fort**. The soldiers of Fort Dobbs enjoy the fruits of the local harvest as they prepare to settle into winter quarters. 10a.m.-4p.m.
- December 6-7: **Wintering in Wartime**. Find out how the garrison of Provincial soldiers lived during the winter of 1755. Visit with the men as they prepare for the coming seasonal festivities. 10a.m-4p.m. Evening program on Saturday from 6p.m.-8p.m.
